Completed Declaration Forms, Flu Cert & Hats (for tagging/checking) must be taken to the secretary's when collecting numbers. Please make sure all your competitors have a copy of the schedule and are aware of the eligibility rules.

Note – Copies of Dressage Tests can be found in the BRC 2019 Rule Book or down loaded from the British Riding Club Website under BRC Downloads. The BRC Fibre-Beet Festival of the Horse Championship is to be held on 18th & 19st May 2019 at Washbrook Farm, Aston-Ie-Walls, Northamptonshire.

Rules

- 1 The competition will be run strictly under British Riding Club Rules 2018.
- 2 In the event of cancellation of this event £5 shall be retained per competitor.
- 3 All entries are accepted only upon the terms of the general rules and conditions below.
- 4 The Judge's decision is final.
- 5 ALL HORSES/PONIES ENTERED FOR BRC QUALIFIERS MUST HAVE A VACCINATION RECORD COMPLYING WITH BRC RULES, THIS RECORD AND PASSPORT MUST BE BROUGHT ON THE DAY OF THE COMPETITION. IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CLUBS TO ENSURE THESE ARE CORRECT. <u>ANY INCORRECT RECORDS WILL RESULT IN</u> <u>DISQUALIFICATION</u>.
- 6 Health and Safety The organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health & safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents and must obey the instructions of the organisers and all officials and stewards,
- 7 Disclaimer of Liability Save for the death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of any event to which these rules apply, nor the British Horse Society, nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies accept any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, vehicles, land or any other person or property whatsoever, whether caused by negligence, breach of contract or in any way what so ever.
- 8 Protective Headgear Protective Headgear must be worn at all times by anyone riding anywhere at a BRC event. Harnesses must be correctly adjusted and fastened. See BRC RULE BOOK for current standards. Failure to do so will incur elimination.

All hats must be tagged with an **AQUA Coloured Tag – BRC, BE or PC**.

- 9 All dogs must be kept on leads at all times while on the show ground.
- 10 Entries will not be accepted without the correct entry fees. Cheques should be made payable to Faversham & District Riding Club. Teams should send a single Riding Club cheque.
- 11 Only riders and/or horses competing may use the warm up facilities at FSC.
- 12 Competitors are requested not to leave litter or muck out horse boxes in the box park.
- 13 Horses must not be tied to horseboxes or trailers & left unattended.
- 14 All ridden horses/ponies must be 4yrs or over.
- 15 Protests These may be lodged only by the Chairman or Chef d'Equipe or nominated representative of the club concerned. These must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of £20.00. They must be addressed to the organiser of the competition.
- 16 All persons attending the show will be deemed to have accepted the rules and conditions.

THIS IS A COMBINED TRAINING COMPETITION FOR SENIORS AND JUNIORS TEAMS of 3 or 4 RIDERS AND INDIVIDUALS.

Class 1 - BRC Junior CT Prelim/75 Class 2 - BRC Seniors CT Prelim/75

BRC CT Dressage test BRC HT 90 Q (2013) plus 75cm Show Jumping BD eligibility is unlimited Prelim Points & 0 Points at Novice level or above. Horses or ponies must not have won any BS winnings, nor must they have BE points at the close of prelim entries

Class 3 - BRC Junior CT Novice/85 Class 4 - BRC Seniors CT Novice/85

BRC CT Dressage Test BRC HT 100 Q (2013) plus 85cm Show Jumping BD eligibility is unlimited Novice Points. Up to 35 Elementary Points, 0 Points at Medium Level or above. Horses or ponies may have up to 225 BS points, up to10 BE points.

Teams consist of either 4 Junior members or 4 Senior members. For Junior Teams - Two members ride in Class 1 & two members ride in Class 3. For Senior Teams – Two members ride in Class 2 & two members ride in Class 4.

BRC Rosettes to be awarded: 1st to 6th

The highest placed individuals not part of the winning qualifying team from each arena will also qualify to compete at the National Championships (Senior & Junior)

Eligibility and Rules: Refer to current BRC Rulebook for full details and Please READ the rule page of this schedule.

Relevant date for age of Juniors riders is to be under 18 on 1st January 2019. Horses may only compete in one class.

All hats must be checked & tagged (AQUA) before competing (unless done so at previous BRC Qualifiers, BE or PC Event) - see BRC Rulebook for hat standards.

Preliminary entries of £30 per team and £9.50 per individual to be made using the official BRC Preliminary entry forms found on the BRC website to be entered by 16th March 2019. Only the Prelim Entry can be made online through the British Horse Society Bookshop.

Detailed entries to be sent to the Show Secretary on the BRC FOTH Entry Forms (see BRC Website) by the 16th March 2019. Please include a copy of the Flu Vacc Identification & Record for all horses not on the Area Database. Also include helpers form, providing one helper per team as well as one helper per two individuals entered please, able to help for the morning or afternoon. Helpers contact details, including mobile phone number & email to be provided with the Area entry form. Failure to provide required helpers (including on the day) will result in Elimination.

Detailed Entry - Fee £95 per team and £25 for Individuals

All cheques should be made payable to 'Faversham & District Riding Club' and have the name of the team and Club printed clearly on the reverse side. One cheque per club please. A charge of £10 will be made for any dishonoured cheques Note: Vaccination rules for qualifying entries. Any incorrect vaccination record will result in disqualification of the horse or pony from the qualifier.

*Only relevant for half day helpers. There is no guarantee that the preferred time will be given, but will be accommodated where possible.

Each club must provide one helper per team entered, as well as one helper per two individuals entered, for the day of the competition. More than one person may be used to cover a helper's slot. This is down to the club to arrange, NOT the organiser. E.g. Each helper is required for an allotted time during the day, so a club may provide up to 2 people to cover this period. However this is still counted as 1 helper.

Club Helpers: It shall be a condition of entry that all Clubs entering supply the names, email address, telephone numbers and relevant experience of the required numbers of helpers who would be willing to help the organising team, for example jump judging, tack checking, stewarding, flu vaccination checks, tea runs etc. These volunteers must be told in advance by their clubs that they will be expected to help during the day and will be informed of their duties and time slot by the event organiser, in the week prior to the competition. This form must be enclosed with the Area Entry. If Club volunteers do not fulfil their duties that Club's riders will be eliminated and not be allowed to continue in the competition.
