Rosettes will be awarded to the first 6 teams and first 6 individuals in each arena.  
Some tests may be done under floodlights.

**CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES: Monday 11 November 2019.**

**Late entries will not be accepted.** entries may be made via email with hard copies to follow.  
**BRC Classes 1-3:** All entrants must pay a prelim entry of £29 per team or £9.50 per individual to British Riding Clubs at least 21 days before the date of the qualifier (10<sup>th</sup> November) Entry forms can be found on the BRC website for postal entries [www.britishridingclubs.org.uk](http://www.britishridingclubs.org.uk) or online entries can be made via the prelim website <https://brc.bhs.org.uk/login?referral=%2Fselect> . Late prelim entries may be accepted at the discretion of the organiser with a late surcharge of £20 per team and £10 per individual (payable to BRC HQ), if there are sufficient spaces. Late entries cannot be guaranteed therefore must not be paid for until approval from the organiser has been sought.

## **CLASS 1 - Junior Intermediate Teams & Individuals**

## **CLASS 2 - Senior Intermediate Teams & Individuals**

- Intermediate Winter Dressage, for teams of 4 riders, with 3 scores to count. One rider will ride a Prelim Test, two a Novice Test and 1 an Elementary Test.
  - a. One member of each team will ride the prelim **Prelim14 (2006)**. Horses may have unlimited Prelim Points but only up to 35 Novice Points and 0 points at Elementary or above.
  - b. One member of each team will ride the novice **Novice 30 (2006)** Horses may have unlimited Novice Points but only up to 35 Elementary Points and 0 points at Medium or above.
  - c. One member of each team will ride the novice **Novice 34 (2009)**. Horses may have unlimited Novice Points but only up to 35 Elementary Points and 0 points at Medium or above.
  - d. One member of each team will ride the elementary **Elementary 44 (2002)**. Horses may have unlimited Elementary Points but only up to 35 Medium Points and 0 points at Adv Medium or above.
- Riders who have competed under FEI rules in the past 5 years prior to the prelim entry being made are not eligible.

## **CLASS 3 - Pick Your Own Test, Junior and Senior Mixed Individuals**

### **Medium 63 (2002) or Advanced Medium 90 (2012).**

- Medium: Horses may have unlimited Medium Points but only up to 35 total points at Advanced Medium or above. Riders who have competed under FEI rules in the past 5 years prior to the prelim entry being made are not eligible
- Adv. Medium: Horses may have unlimited Adv. Medium Points but only up to 35 total points at Advanced or above.

## **CLASS 4 – Area Friendly Teams & Individuals**

- Area Friendly, for teams of 3 or 4 riders, with 3 scores to count. Teams may be made up of a mix of Senior and Junior riders. One rider will ride an Intro Test, two a Prelim Test and one a Novice Test. A rider may only ride once in team but may ride as an individual at a different level.
  - a. One member of each team will ride the prelim **Intro B (2009)**. Horses must have 0 BD points.
  - b. One member of each team will ride the prelim **Prelim 7 (2002 rev 2016)**. Horses may have unlimited Prelim Points but only up to 35 Novice Points and 0 points at Elementary or above.
  - c. One member of each team will ride the prelim **Prelim 18 (2002)**. Horses may have unlimited Prelim Points but only up to 35 Novice Points and 0 points at Elementary or above.
  - d. One member of each team will ride the novice **Novice 27 (2007)**. Horses may have unlimited Novice Points, up to 35 Elementary Points and 0 points at Medium or above

**Junior riders must be under 18 on the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2019.**

### Helpers:

Any BRC club entering a team **must** provide one helper per team and one helper per 2 individuals please, able to help for the morning or afternoon. Helpers contact details, including mobile phone number & email to be provided with the Entry Form. Failure to provide required helpers (including on the day) will result in Disqualification G16.2

**Equine Influenza Certificate:** All competitors in the Riding Club Qualifiers must have an up to date Equine Influenza Certificate in line with rule G7 in the current BRC Rulebook, which must, under penalty of Disqualification accompany the horse to this competition and the competitor is responsible for producing it on demand. **For all those horses not on the area database, a photocopy must be sent to the Entries Secretary with the Official Entry Form. There is also a checking device on the BRC website, but if you are unsure, please call BRC on 02476 840518.**

This competition will run under British Riding Club Rules. It is important that all competitors are aware of the rules relating to this competition – please see the current BRC Handbook and also the BRC Rule Amendments and Changes Document which can be found at the link below:

### General Rules & Conditions of Entry

To be run under BRC Official Rules 2019 There May be new Rules for the Championships which will come into effect 1<sup>st</sup> January 2020 but unless specified in a rule amendment this qualifier will run under 2019 rules

1. All entries are accepted only upon the terms of the general rules and conditions. Making an entry shall be deemed to be an acceptance of the rules and conditions.
2. The judges' decisions are final.
3. If the date of the qualifier is cancelled for any reason, the close of prelim entry will remain. However, if the qualifier is moved more than 21 days later, entries will be re-opened but late entry fees cannot be refunded. Eligibility will be approved at the original close of prelim entry.
4. In the event of cancellation of this event £2 shall be retained from each competitor to cover administrative expenses.
5. **Health & Safety** – The organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents and must obey the instructions of the organisers and all officials and stewards.
6. **Disclaimer of Liability** – Save for the death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of any event to which these rules apply, nor the British Horse Society, nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, vehicles, land or any other person or property whatsoever, whether caused by negligence, breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever.
7. **Protective Headgear**- All hats must have a visible aqua BRC/BE/PC hat tag in place before they are used for warming up and competing, to show that it meets the current safety standards. There will be a trained official available on the day to do this for you if your hat does not currently have one. For up to date hat rules please see the current handbook.
8. No Lunging in the warm up areas
9. All lorries and trailers must be parked with their front ends in first in an orderly fashion in the designated parking areas only. Do not muck out your box in the lorry park.
10. **DOGS MUST BE KEPT ON LEADS AT ALL TIMES AND NOT ALLOWED INTO THE INDOOR ARENA.**
11. **NO HORSE MAY BE LEFT UNATTENDED WHILST TIED UP TO YOUR LORRY OR TRAILER.**

# BRC Hat Rules 2019 v1

Only hats to the following specification are acceptable at ANY BRC activity. At all BRC Area Qualifiers and Championships, hats must show a visible AQUA 'hat tag'.

This can be a BRC, BE or PC aqua tag. Any other standards / dates are NOT acceptable and will not be tagged. Hats must meet ALL of the requirements of one of the following rows:

**IMPORTANT INFO FOR THE CROSS COUNTRY PHASE:** Only a "Jockey Skull" of an even round or elliptical shape with a smooth or slightly abrasive surface, having no peak or peak type extensions may be worn for any XC phase. Noticeable protuberances above the eyes or to the front, not greater than 5mm, smooth and rounded in nature are permitted. It must also comply with the 'Protective Headwear' criteria and be tagged as set out above. A removable hat cover with a light flexible peak may be used.

The use of **HEAD CAMS** are strictly prohibited at any BRC affiliated competition. This includes use on the head, chest, bridle or any other part of the horse or rider.

\*There is no guarantee that the preferred time will be given, but will be accommodated where possible. If available all day please state. Also state if any times not available, eg helping a rider.

**Each club must provide the required number of helpers as stated in the schedule. More than one person may be used to cover a helper's slot. This is down to the club to arrange, NOT the organiser. E.g. if a helper is required for a full day then a club may provide 3 people to cover this period. However this is still counted as 1 helper. See schedule for details of number helpers required per team.**

**Club Helpers:** It shall be a condition of entry that all Clubs entering supply the names, email address, telephone numbers and relevant experience of the required numbers of helpers who would be willing to help the organising team, for example jump judging, tack checking, stewarding, tea runs etc. These volunteers must be told in advance by their clubs that they will be expected to **help for all the allotted time** and will be informed of their duties by the event organiser, in the week prior to the competition. If Club volunteers do not fulfil their duties that Club's riders will be Disqualified and not be allowed to continue in the competition.
